When the **Science Group** planned a visit to Jodrell Bank during the 70th anniversary year of the site, we didn't realise that our chosen date, 2nd August, was also the 60th anniversary of the day when the first signals were received by the Lovell telescope in 1957. This was just a few weeks before the USSR launched Sputnik 1 and began the space age. Sputnik was launched using a modified intercontinental ballistic missile which meant that the telescope was extremely useful to the British and American governments and their NATO allies who were trying to keep track of what the USSR were doing during the Cold War.

To mark the 60th anniversary of 'first light' on

the Lovell Telescope, the second radio telescope at Jodrell Bank, the Mark II, together with some ancillary buildings, were granted listed building status by English Heritage and the press and TV were on site to report on the story.

While our group did not feature on North West Tonight (as far as we know), we were given a fascinating range of information about the workings of the site and of the science of exploring the universe using radio wave detectors rather than optical telescopes.

We learnt that the Lovell telescope is so sensitive that it could pick up a mobile phone signal from Mars, so all phones need to be switched off on the site. When the Soviet Union's Luna 9 unmanned spacecraft sent back the first pictures from the surface of the moon in 1966, Jodrell Bank intercepted the signal and, using a fax machine borrowed from a Manchester newspaper office, produced the picture and published it to the world before the Soviets officially released it. Also, as of 2nd August 2017, there are only two listed buildings in England that can move around and both of them are at Jodrell Bank!

Despite being fairly close by, this was the first time that several of our party had been to Jodrell Bank and everyone enjoyed the visit.

My four-year-old grandchild recently asked "What's a hipster?"

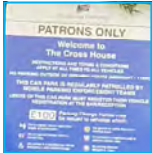
"Someone who will wear something just to look different," I said. "They'll often buy clothes in charity shops and wear thick glasses."
