Owing to increased demand, we cannot reserve tickets: **Tickets will be allocated on a first come and paid for – first reserved basis.** A separate cheque is required for each outing and **it is essential that members include their telephone number with each booking.** Several cheques have been received with no information and I have struggled to identify what they are for. If no contact details are provided, I am unable to contact people when outings are fully booked.

Bootle Town Hall

It was a lovely sunny day and to our surprise we were greeted by the Mayor, Councillor Dave Robinson who proudly showed **Local History Group 14** around the imposing at Bootle Town Hall. He is a local man and his knowledge and pride in Bootle's history was evident throughout our tour. He recalled local philanthropists, notably William Poulson, twice Mayor of Bootle, who together with his wife, Mary, was

very involved in improving social conditions. Bootle's former great days and achievements were severely damaged during the last war, including the Town Hall, parts of which were rebuilt and redesigned. The hospital and the swimming baths are long gone whilst the museum which contained Anne Goodison's Egyptology Collection, now in the Atkinson, Southport, is no longer in use.



We saw the impressive Council Chamber and other meeting rooms where beautiful silverware was on display, as well as plaques and flags linking Bootle's ties with sea trade and its involvement in the last war. The Mayor was particularly proud of the Royal Naval Commander, Johnnie Walker, stationed locally during the war, whose mission was to protect the convoy from attacks by enemy submarines. Apparently his success was due to sometimes bypassing the rules. Numerous items honouring his memory were on display and his former colleagues and crewmen organised an association, meeting annually, until inevitably the years took their toll. It was impressive that the Mayor, years younger than most of us, was so aware of the war years, the devastation from the unavoidable danger of the surrounding dockland area and the indomitable spirit of the times. His work as a Councillor and his enthusiasm to ensure Bootle will continue to thrive was infectious.

The Town Hall facilities, the lovely ballroom and the theatre are in regular use by local schools and various groups with fundraising events for the Mayor's fund held throughout the year.

The current Mayor seems unstoppable and I felt inspired to make the most of the coming year. Finally may I add a personal thank you to Margaret Edwards who kindly took care of the last minute arrangements for the visit because I was unable to.
