Halkyn Mountain

Walking Group 6 visited Halkyn Mountain in November. The weather was cold and clear so we had excellent views over the River Dee and Clwydian Range including Moel Famau. The area has been quarried for limestone for several hundred years and the limekilns were built in the 19th Century. Today there are three large quarries and we had a good view of one of them from above. Lead was mined there from Roman times until the last century. We also visited an iron age hill fort, which is now a reservoir and a Millennium stone. After the walk we enjoyed tea and cake at the Tea Rooms at the Holywell Pet Cemetery.
