In November our **Cookery group** spent a very pleasant afternoon visiting Sunnyfields in Hightown. You might not think a farm would be the place for a cookery event, but there was a part that was of particular interest.

Our host for the day was Andrew Tumilty, who jointly runs the farm with his sister Anne. Andrew provided us with a very warm welcome and a brief history of the farm before we had a tour of the premises. Initially a nursery, the farm is now diversifying into livestock and a highlight of the tour was a visit to see the pigs, which then led to the main reason we came – sausage making!

The farm butchery is attached to the farm shop that sells a wide range of locally produced products, from veg and meat to honey and candles. After a demonstration of the sausage-making process, Eileen and Mary both had a go at stringing up the newly made sausages. This proved trickier than it looked, but they persevered before eventually deciding to leave it to the experts.

Tea and cake provided by our host was very welcome after all our efforts and Andrew very generously gave members samples of the sausages we had seen being made. These proved to be delicious but how much credit the Cookery group can take for this is debateable.

One of our members, Derek Perry (in yellow), is Jimmy Lowe's grandson. On a picture on the interpretation board of all of Jimmy's family, on the extreme right, there is Derek as a dear little 4 year old! The wood sculpture of Jimmy Lowe is one of a number forming the Asparagus Trail which celebrates Formby's past and present excellence in asparagus growing.

Later on in our ride and in pursuance of more public art, we went to Ainsdale, near the beach, to view the amazing mural of a Sand Lizard, across all the fronts of the buildings that formed and adjoined the old Toad Hall Night Club. This was created by Paul Curtis who has done many other large paintings on buildings in Merseyside, including Red Rum on the Southport Promenade.

Annual General Meeting, 9th March 2022

The AGM will be held at 2pm on Wednesday 9th March 2022 in Holy Trinity Parish Hall, Rosemary Lane, Formby. The formal notice of the meeting was published in the December Newsletter.

A draft Agenda for the AGM is outlined below. At present we have not received a nomination for Chairman and have vacancies for 7 Committee Members. Please consider helping to run your u3a by joining the committee either in a specific Officer role, or as a Committee Member. We welcome new people and new ideas. Everyone has skills and abilities which can contribute to the smooth running of *your* u3a. Without members volunteering to be on the Committee Formby u3a cannot exist. Please talk to any existing Committee member if you feel able to help.

We are proposing changes to the Constitution to allow on-line meetings and filling of casual vacancies, as recommended by the Third Age Trust. We are also proposing reducing the number of Officers and the minimum number of Trustees required in order to reduce the risk of Formby u3a having to fold because we are not able to get volunteers to fill the Officer and Trustee positions required by our current Constitution. These changes will need to be agreed by the Third Age Trust beforehand.
